Co-op Belle Vue Art five year overview

The art curriculum at Co-op Belle Vue is designed to develop students' skills and experiences to help them to connect with their own culture and that of the wider world. We teach skills that pupils can actively use after their time at Bellevue and introduce them to ways of working that our children may not have ever encountered before.

We use a progression model where pupils build on core subject knowledge and skills and develop these over the years students are with us. Curriculum is planned with this in mind and builds on prior knowledge so that pupils can build schema and make links while seeing their own development.

Year 7 Long Term Plan

In year 7, students will learn the core foundational skills in art. They will be given an Artist that explores the formal elements and be introduced to these in a series of demonstrations and skill based tasks. Students will learn about Artists, a craftsperson and cultures. They will learn how to research, experiment, critique an artist's work, plan and create a personal response.
